- ❖ **Wheels-2-Work Scheme:** Wheels 2 Work (a not for profit charity) has a fleet of mopeds for loan. Successful candidates receive a moped, safety equipment, insurance, tax and bike servicing for a small weekly contribution. To be eligible you must: live in North Yorkshire, be 16 or over, have no suitable transport to travel to work, training or education, hold a provisional licence.
