1 Parish Council Update

Recycling: North Yorkshire Council Councillor confirmed that tin cans, plastic and glass can now be placed in one recycling container with immediate effect.

No dogs are allowed in all play park areas: by order of the public spaces protection orders (**PSPOs**) under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. New signage will be displayed accordingly.

New bench for the village: A new bench was purchased by a resident for the benefit of the village and in particular those living in the bungalows on Moor Road and St James Close. Prior to its purchase it was suggested it could be sited on the land under the Cherry blossom tree near the Old Methodist Chapel. This would assist them on their normal walk 'around the block' as it would provide a place to have a little rest and a chat with friends and neighbours.

This was discussed by the Parish Council with RDC in January of this year as the land owners and agreed it would be a good place for it to be sited. In the past there had always been a bench looking back up Moor Road, where the grit bin in now situated. There was an objection from a resident as people using the bench would be able to see into the window of their home. The bench will look down and across Moor Road towards the old garage which is in the process of being demolished. A concern was raised that older children would congregate and cause noise and nuisance. A large number of residents have since been spoken with by members of the Parish Council and asked for comments regarding nuisance and noise from surrounding areas including the play parks. All of them have said it is not the case. It has to be said that all of residents spoken with have said the behaviour of our older children in the village is very good. The Parish Council will now go ahead and site the bench under the Cherry Blossom tree facing down and across Moor Road on what is now NYC land.

Keeping the Beck clear and trees, shrubs and hedge rows trimmed back to the wall boundaries: The Parish Council would like to remind residents that hedges, trees and shrubs along the roads and footpaths around the village and into the Beck should remain trimmed. It is the responsibility of residents to ensure they are cut back to their boundary. The Beck needs to remain clear to protect the watercourse.

Melsonby Parish Show will take place on 12th August 2023 in the school. Anyone from Melsonby can take part. The categories are vegetables, flowers, photos, crafts and baking.

Matrix Board (vehicle activated sign) – A question has been raised about the positioning of the matrix boards. The Parish Council follow strict guidance from North Yorkshire Council (NYC). NYC agree a location with the Parish Council and are contracted to install the pole that hosts the matrix board. The pole needs to be at least 100m within the speed limit because of the radar, it will detect approaching vehicles up to 100m away.

Memorial Tree: The carved tree is situated on the village green. Anyone who lives or has lived in Melsonby may place a plaque on the tree, in memory of a relative or friend who has had connections with the village.
