## 1 Parish Council Update

**St James Close remedial work:** The Parish Council have raised concerns with Highways regarding the poor road remedial works completed at St James Close. Highways have acknowledged these concerns, been onsite themselves and are meeting with the contractors to address this.

The picnic tables at Moor Road Play Park are in need of repair. The Parish Council are looking at the tables and will make a decision to repair or replace them.

Melsonby Bell Project – Can you help? The church bells are held on worn out and dated fittings, they are very difficult to ring for beginners and having four bells' limits what can be rung by experienced ringers. This makes it difficult to teach and retain ringers and to attract existing ringers. The Keltek Trust, a charity that rescues bells from closed churches, has offered a set of six bells from a former church near Leeds. It is proposed to install these six bells and two newly cast bells on modern fittings. The 1370 and 1718 bells will remain in the church. The Parish Council would ask that residents report ALL sewage and water overflow incidents to Northumbrian Water as a POLLUTION EVENT. The more residents that report these problems as a POLLUTION EVENT will help keep a record and build a bigger picture of how this impacts the village. If you do have photo or video evidence of the incident, please include to NW. Please email this to the Clerk melsonbyp8@gmail.com as the Parish Council will continue to log and keep a record of every incident.

**Northumbrian Water (NW) update:** The Parish Council met with NW on 24<sup>th</sup> November 2023 to discuss the log of incidents collated by the Parish Council over a number of years. The extensive list from the Parish Council differed from Northumbrian Water and the Environment Agency information. Councilors' have agreed that a response will be collated with the full incident log to Northumbrian Water and will include Rishi Sunak PM, North Yorkshire Council and the Environment Agency in this correspondence.
