Parish Council Update

Green Bins being replaced – Concerns have been raised with NYC as the current green bins are being replaced for larger bins. The larger bins could be more difficult to maneuver for some residents especially when full. Have NYC considered how this will affect residents? **The Parish Council is awaiting a response.**

Green Bins annual fee increase - The existing small green bins are to be replaced by a 240l bin at double the cost. NYC is standardising bin size and price across the new county. A full explanation from NYC Councillor Angus Thompson is available to view on the Parish Council Facebook page and website.

Could you Volunteer as a Community First Responder? There is currently one resident in Melsonby who is a part of the Community First Responder Scheme for the NHS. Could you spare 5 Hours minimum per week to provide the village with a valuable service. Melsonby currently shares Gilling's kit, however if responders can grow in numbers, we could gain a dedicated Melsonby kit. Precept 24/25 – The Parish Council have agreed the precept for 24/25 – The precept is a tax that Parish, Town and Community Council's charge their local residents in order to cover spending on service delivery within the community. This includes services such as playing fields, village green, street furniture, open spaces and more.

Local Councils do not receive funding from central government, so they need the Precept plus any other income they generate from services or facilities they provide (such as burial ground). The precept has increased by 5% to £12,291. **A new grant is available for North Yorkshire residents** to help make homes more energy efficient. The Home Upgrade Grant phase 2 (HUG2) is available to help homes that are not on mains gas and have poor quality insulation and inefficient heating systems. The grant can be used for improvements such as insulation and solar panels, to air source heat pumps and smart heating controls. These will help save money on energy bills and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. To qualify for the new scheme residents must have a household income of £31,000 or less and/or meet other eligibility checks. Private rented properties are eligible to apply although landlords must contribute at least a third of the total cost of the upgrade. This scheme is now open and we are working with community interest company YES Energy Solutions who will deliver the improvements to homes. You can also visit NYC's website <u>www.northyorks.gov.uk/hug2</u> to register your details to find out more about the scheme. **Melsonby Bell Project – Can you help?** The church bells are held on worn out and dated fittings, they are very difficult to ring for beginners and having four bells' limits what can be rung by experienced ringers. This makes it difficult to teach and retain ringers and to attract existing ringers. The Keltek Trust, a charity that rescues bells from closed churches, has offered a set of six bells from a former church near Leeds. It is proposed to install these six bells and two newly cast bells on modern fittings. The 1370 and 1718 bells will remain in the church. The Parish Council would ask that residents report ALL sewage and water overflow incidents to Northumbrian Water as a POLLUTION EVENT. Email - <u>care@nwl.co.uk</u> for the attention of David Walker, Sewer Flooding Team. The more residents that report these problems as a POLLUTION EVENT will help keep a record and build a bigger picture of how this impacts the village. The Stepping Up Programme: Being ran by North Yorkshire Police and North Yorkshire Sport and referrals can be made direct to the scheme. Stepping up is an early intervention and prevention programme for young people beginning to show signs of engaging in risky behavior. This may be appearing at School, Home or within the local community.

No Cold Calling Signs: The Parish Council have no cold calling stickers that residents can display in their homes. The stickers are available to pick up from the information Centre (old phone box).

Stokesley and District Community Care Assoc: Operate a Community Car Scheme in our area.
